Responsibilities

This is a full-time position within the research team, responsible for research and implementation in the climate governance project.

The climate governance project focuses on global initiatives to address climate change, including international conventions, multilateral and bilateral cooperation frameworks, and international mechanisms related to clean technology supply chains. The goal is to monitor progress and challenges in these areas, identify opportunities for collaboration, build trust among stakeholders, and promote technological progress to support ambitious climate action, the stable operation of global low-carbon technology supply chains and the global low-carbon transition.

- Assist in formulating project strategies and implementation plans.
- Write climate governance-related research reports and briefs, involving literature reviews, quantitative analysis, and field research.
- Monitor developments and trends in relevant domestic and international issue areas, write opinion articles, and conduct policy analysis and interpretation.
